

DTS'S FIVE COMPONENTS FOR A SAFE AND HEALTHY FALL SEMESTER

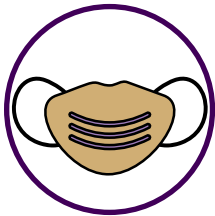
The following Five Components for a Safe and Healthy Fall Semester are a summary of our more robust Fall 2020 Enhanced Health and Safety Plan for Campus-Based, In-Person Instruction. This plan allows DTS to provide the healthiest learning environment possible while continuing to offer the best theological education available.

The five main components of a safe and healthy fall semester at DTS are:



1. PREVENTION

- We have increased routine cleaning for all rooms, hallways, and surfaces; added nightly deep cleaning using hospital grade disinfectant.
- Hand sanitizer is available in all classrooms and at all entrances.
- We have increased outside airflow in classroom HVAC systems.



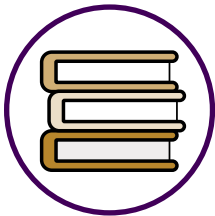
2. FACE-COVERINGS AND SOCIAL DISTANCING

- All DTS faculty, staff, and students must wear face-coverings in all campus buildings and classrooms unless alone in their workspace.
- All courses have been moved to larger classrooms to enable six-feet of physical distancing.
- Entrances, exits, stairwells, and hallways in our main buildings will have directional signage and modified pedestrian traffic flow to better maintain physical distancing.



3. INCIDENT RESPONSE

- The COVID-19 Task Force will monitor reports from local health officials to respond to developing COVID-19 guidelines and policies.
- Any student or employee with symptoms or exposure to an infected person will self-isolate according to CDC guidance.



4. SEMESTER ADJUSTMENTS

- Courses will shift from in-person to video conferencing for the final three weeks after the Thanksgiving break (11/30–12/18).
- All DTS courses are prepared to move to online instruction if warranted by additional outbreaks.



5. REMOTE OPTIONS

- DTS has a variety of online education options for students who do not want to take in-person classes for Fall 2020.
- Students and faculty taking in-person classes who are exposed to COVID-19 will be allowed to continue the semester with remote learning.

This plan applies to both our main Dallas campus and our Houston campus. For DTS students at our Washington, DC, campus, courses will move entirely online due to local regulations and our host-church's request. For students who attend courses at our Atlanta campus or our other regional locations, we are monitoring each location and will be issuing definitive guidelines for those courses shortly.
